# Fairfield High School for Girls

#### Summer School Programme 2021

## Overview

To support our new pupils in their transition to Fairfield High School for Girls, we delivered a Summer School during August 2021. This was funded by the DfE and allowed pupils to become familiar with the school building, our staff and each other, as well as them receiving some academic support in the way of Maths and English tuition.

Each day pupils benefitted from two hours of tuition, delivered by the Tutor Trust using a programme selected by us and informed by pupil prior attainment data. Pupils were arranged in small groups of 4-6 with Teaching Assistant support available for the most vulnerable pupils.

In addition to academic support, pupils took part in a range of enrichment activities to support their individual interests and wellbeing. The programme for each week is below. All 199 pupils in the year group were invited to join us, each pupil being invited to one of two weeks we delivered.

#### Summary

159 pupils attended in total over the 2 weeks. 28 of these pupils were classed as disadvantaged (out of 34 in the cohort). Our Senior Leadership Team and Admin team worked hard before the summer to chase up responses from parents/carers to ensure as many pupils as possible could/would benefit from this intervention and support.

In addition to 15 of our own staff giving up time to deliver activities and supervise and support pupils, we also worked with The Tutor Trust, Progressive Lettings (who delivered yoga and dodgeball sessions) and professional artist, Razwan UI Haq (who delivered the Arabic Calligraphy sessions).

Staff were paid for their time and preparations and our catering service, Aspens, provided meals for pupils throughout the week. Please see below for a breakdown of how the funding was spent. Feedback from our Summer School has been outstanding so we know this is a very effective investment.
